The John Graham family were early pioneers and had a farm offithme Garrison Rd.(No 3 Hy.) but lived next north to the Walter Curtiss family Their fourse children were Amy (musician) Margaret, Mary (Called Queen) and Richard (called Dick) John Graham ran an insurance buisiness there which was caried on by Margaret after his death and then by Amy. After serving as a guard in the army during WWl along the Welland Canal Dick developing T.B. and later worked on the Mail train to and from Toronto and, I believe with the Insurance.

Mr. A.T. Elliot was the druggest on the boulevard at the corner where the ferry boat docked.
