

# This Indenture

made (in duplicate,) the Ninth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy Five — IN PURSUANCE OF THE ACT passed in the 35th year of the reign of HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA, and CHAPTERED 107, and in PURSUANCE OF THE ACT RESPECTING SHORT FORMS OF CONVEYANCES:

Between Sir Charles A. Murray of the City of London England, at present Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at Port of Lisbon, Portugal of the First Part, and Edith Murray of the same place (wife of the said party of the First Part.) Of the Second Part and Thomas Raney, Francis Ellwood, William Ellwood, Thomas Loverage, William Bell, all of the village of Fort Erie in the County of Welland and Province of Ontario, and Edwin Atwood and Richard Graham of the Township of Bertie in the County of Welland and in said Province

The Trustees of the Fort Erie Church Congregation of the ~~Wesleyan~~ Methodist Church in Canada, ~~in connection with the English Conference,~~ of the Third Part.

Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of Sixty Five dollars of lawful money of Canada, now paid by the said Trustees to the said party of the First Part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) he the said party of the First Part Doth Grant and assign unto the said Trustees and their successors in the said trusts

All and Singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Village of Fort Erie in the County of Welland and in said Province, being composed of Villages Lot Number four on the North side of Bertie Street Sixty six feet front on Bertie Street and one Hundred and forty Eight and one half feet deep as laid down on a plan made for James Wadsworth Esquire comprising the Land of the Late Admiral Henry A. Murray
