Frederick Burger a German soldier of the 34th. Regt. who had been discharged from the army at his own request: asserted in a petition that he had settled in the summer of 1784, on a lot fronting on the Niagara River near the mouth of Frenchmans Creek.

township of Bertie. cont. 150 acres: comp. of lot#1 in the front con. being on the shore of land, above Grand Island



GEORGE BURGER WA S Born in 1805; Whrweiler, Alsacewhich belonged to France at the time. He migrated to Canada in 1856 with his family. They left La Havre and sailed to New York, taking 52 days. It was a very stormy crossing and they dispaired of reaching the new land safely. From New York they travelled to Buffalo, and crossing the Niagara River to Fort Erie. From there they travelled in open wagon to Stevensville. George Burger a son had imigrated to Canada in 1849 to escape Military Service; and it is presumed that the family travelled to Stevensville to join him.
