

PALMER, JOSEPH (1739-1802), broken front and lots one and two in the first concession, one and two in the second concession, and one and two in the third concession from Lake Erie.

"His petition, 13th May, 1793, stated that he had served for thirty six years and had been discharged from the 34th Regt. with the rank of Sergeant. He presented his discharge signed by Major Robert Hoyes, certifying that he has served upwards of twenty years (23 yrs in the same company). He added that "he is incapable of labour & notwithstanding his industry finds himself at present under circumstances bordering on distress, had he been capable of cultivating the lands generously given him, his circumstances would have been easy." He prayed for an appointment to a vacant office in the customs."

His sons, John (1772-1819) and Joseph Richard were each granted 200 acres. John married Caty, a daughter of Sergeant Lewis Maybee.
