

Dr. Charles Streets::: 1923.

Born in Fort Erie Dr. Charles Streets was persuaded by Dr. William Douglas to take up practise in the town, after completeing his education at the Toronto Medical School. He started in his practise Aug. 1st. 1923. He was appointed divisional surgeon for the Wabash and Canadian National Railways. He was long associated with The Douglas Memorial Hospital, and took  $\frac{1}{2}$ art in its building and equipping. He served on the board for many years in a number of positions, eventually been made the chief of staff, a job he held for ten years.

He served in the armed forces , where he was Senior Officer of the Canadian Army; and in charge of all Medical Staff: 1944- 1946. He returned to Fort Erie after the war and was made coroner for the Town.

He died in Fort Erie Dec. 10th. 1968.
