Mrs. Bown, 96; Nephew, 71, Die on Same Day in Ft. Erie

FT. ERIE, Ont., June 30—
Two members of a well-known
local family, Mrs. Garrick
Bown, 96, and her nephew, Rob-
ert Reingald Bown, 71, died
here Wednesday.

Mrs. Bown, the former Caro-
line Jekel, was Ft. Erie's oldest
resident. Since the death of her
husband, a former locomotive
engineer, 20 years ago, Mrs.
Bown lived alone at 17 Winte-
