He then became a merchant on a considerable scale at Queenston; importing annually he afirmed in 1796, goods to the value of £ 2,000 Halifax Currency. He removed to Fort Erie where he obtained a licence of occupation of a site for a store on the Military Reserve near the Fort; but again removed to a situation near the Ferry (Bertie) where his buildings were destroyed by a raiding party early in the war."
