Surviving is her foster son, Albert and his wife Candace Thwaites, their children Frank, Linda, Scott, Heather Thwaites; Andy, Gail, Joyce and Sharon Morellato, all of Niagara Falls. She was predeceased by one brother, Fermin Miller.

Cremation has taken place and her ashes were interred in the family plot at Drummond Hill Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

A memorial service was held in Chippawa Presbyterian Church Monday to honor Miss Zettie May Miller, a highly respected lifelong resident of the area. The service was conducted by Rev. Dr. W. J. Clyde Ervine, minister of the church, and the senior choir provided special music.

Miss Miller of 10569 Niagara River Parkway, died at Greater Niagara General Hospital Nov. 15. The daughter of the late William and Priscilla Miller, she was born Dec. 10, 1885, and resided on the homestead property all her life.

Miss Miller was very active in the community and was the main founder of the Willoughby Historical Museum and saw her life's desire and dreams come true when it was organized. She was also a founder, charter member and honorary president of the Willoughby Historical Society and was still very active, rarely missing a meeting. She was also a charter member and honorary member of the Willoughby Women's Institute.

She was a lifelong member of the Chippawa Presbyterian Church and of the Women's Missionary Society of the church.
