HE COWTHARD INN::: NIAGARA RIVER RD. by Ctherine St.

Not much is known of this Inn, although it is marked on the early maps of the 1850's. It could have been here much earlier. In the 1840's Kerby had the Ferry moved back to the original site by the foot of Bertie, however Lewis and McKenzie continued to operate boats from the foot of Ctherine well in the the middle. 860's .There is no record of when this placeof business closed, however when a fight broke out on this site during the Fennian Raids, there is no mention of the Inn although The Lewis house across the street appears in several accounts as a hiding place. The plot of land on which this hotel and the Customs House along side it, has for years been covered by the waters of the

Viagara River. Nothing has been handes down of the Cowthard family, nowever there are two stones remaining behind the back wall of St. Paul's Anglican Church.
