NATURAL GAS REGULATIONS.

The following NATURAL GAS REGULATIONS and Certificate, adopted at Annual Meeting, October, 1893, apply only to places inspected and found to be up to the standard required by the Association.

1st.—That the following standard for work be adopted :

That a sufficient number of safety tanks through which the gas can freely escape at a pressure not exceeding 8 ozs. be provided in each place where natural gas is used.

That each tank have a properly protected glass gauge tube on outside with scale to show depth of liquid above bottom of dip pipe in tank.

That no by-pass be allowed to any regulator except it be in connection with and governed by 8 oz. safety tank.

That all regulators be provided with suitable pressure gauges on high and low pressure sides.

2nd.—That before permits are granted for the use of natural gas in any place the works supplying the gas shall be inspected by the Inspector of the C. F. U. A., and reported as being up to the standard required :

3rd.—That before granting a permit the assured shall furnish to the Company granting such permit a certificate from the Gas Company in the following terms :

N. E.—The Assessment Act enacts:—That in case any party neglects to pay his taxes as aforesaid, for ten days after demand, the Collector may, by himself or by his Agent, levy the same with costs, by distress of the Goods and Chattels of the party who ought to pay the same, or of any Goods and Chattels in his possession wherever the same may be found within the County.....The goods of the owner of the premises found thereon shall be liable to distress for such taxes whether such owner is assessed in respect of such premises or not.—Sec. 7, Ass't. Amdt. Act, 1896.
