The date of the original log school on Eagle St., remains in doubt; however the early books in the possession of Louis Climenhage date 1864.

The red brick school was built on the original site in 1880.

The first class registered from the log school was comprised of::

It was customery for all the exams to be oral, and many of the old families in the area, sent members to hear the pupils. To reduce the upkeep it was also customery for the residents of the area, to supply wood for the box-stove.

The schoold road ran along Black Creek and in alte March when it flooded it was almost impossible for the children to get to school.
