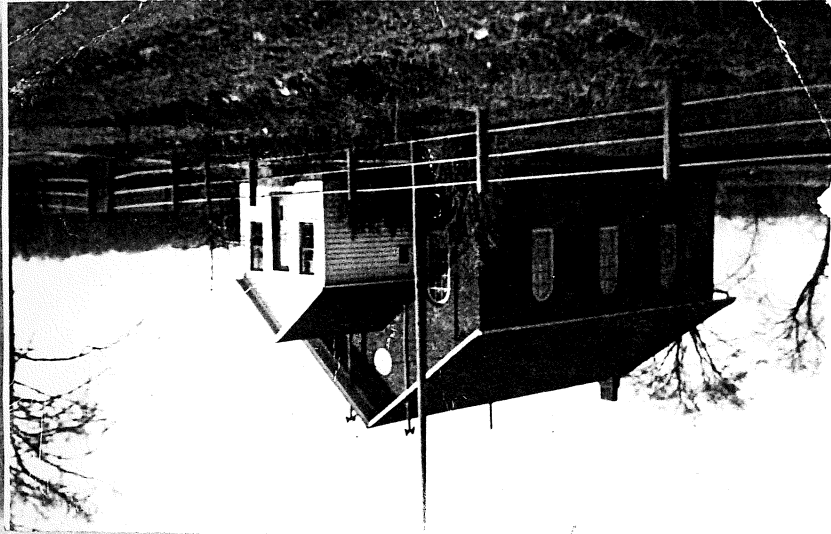

S.S. # 7 . Eagle St. Bertie Township. 1955 -1967

This small but modern school, was built in the 50's to replace the old red brick school that stood on the opposite of the road, and was later sold for a private residence.

The new # 7 is built of concrete, brick, glass and tile; complete with automatic gas heat, double glassed wall sized windows, tiled floors, staff room, music room, washrooms with continuous running water provided by a 72 ft. deep well on the premises. It has modern lighting & blackboards with tackboards above, in each of the classrooms. These classrooms can be made into one large assembly room by sliding back the partitions.
