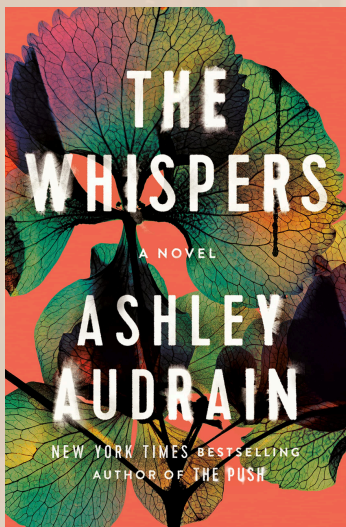

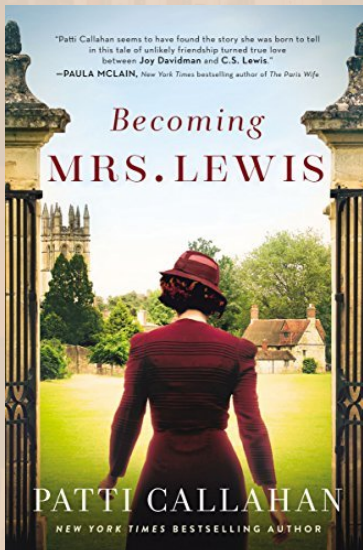

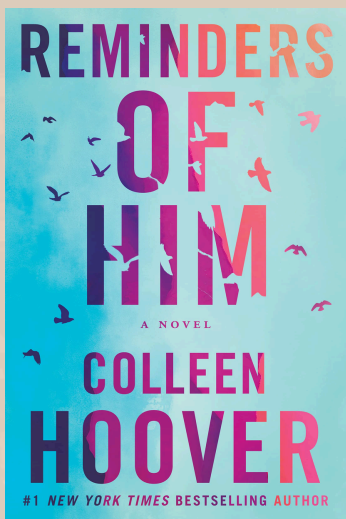
The Whispers by Ashley Audrain

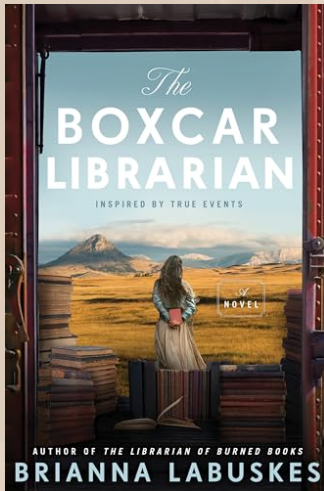
Becoming Mrs. Lewis by Patti Callahan

This is a fictionalized account of the relationship from Joy's point of view detailing her failing marriage, her travels to England from America and finding love with the renowned author.



Reminders of Him by Colleen Hoover

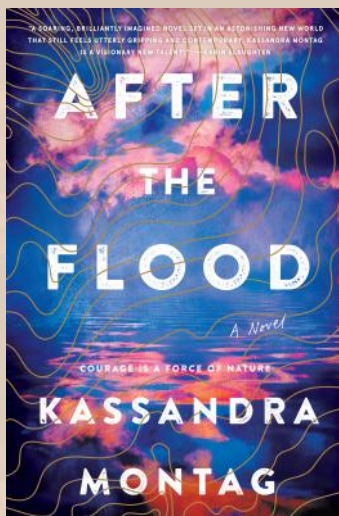
The Boxcar Librarian by Brianna Labuskes

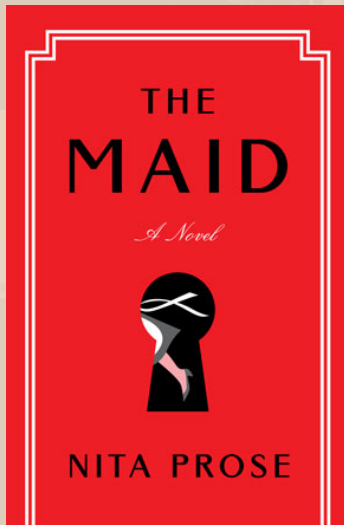
Elphie: A Wicked Childhood by Gregory Maguire

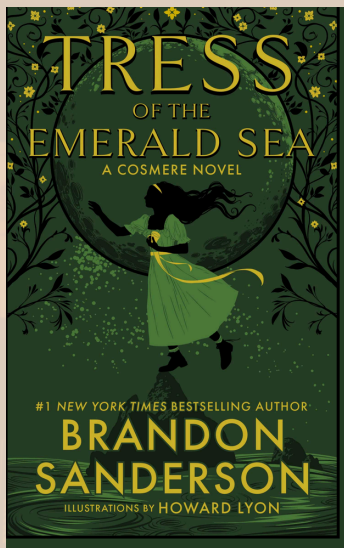
After the Flood by Kassandra Montag

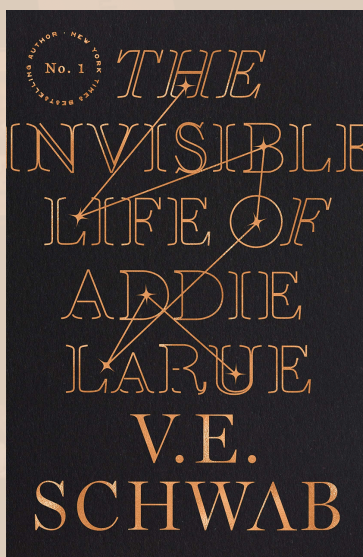
The Maid by Nita Prose

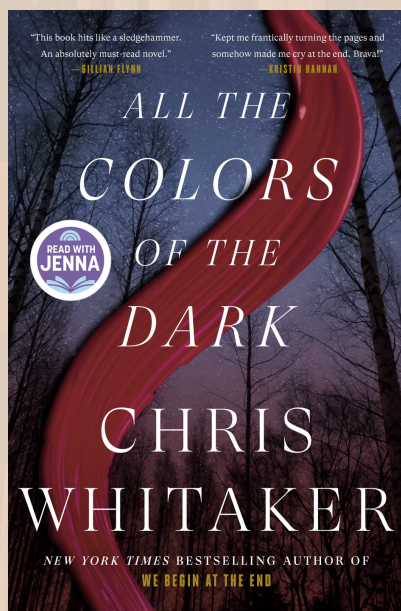
The Invisible Life of Addie La Rue by V.E. Schwab

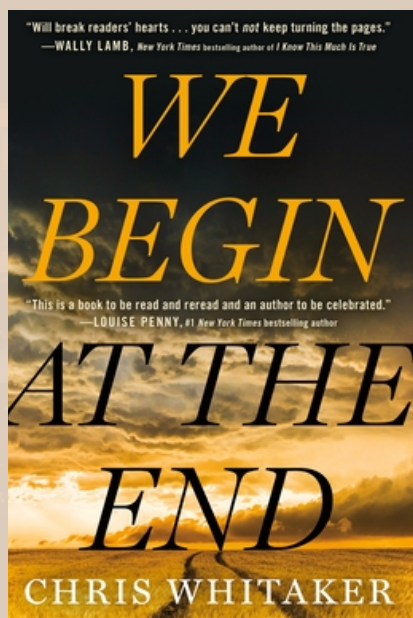
The Island of Missing Trees by Elif Shafak

Two star-crossed teenagers meet in secret in a taverna in Cyprus and gradually fall in love. A tree grows through the roof of the taverna, bearing witness to their meetings and the years following when war breaks out and the teenagers leave. Decades later one of the teenagers, now a botanist, returns looking for native species and his lost love. Meanwhile in London, a ficus grows in a woman's garden, her only connection to an island she has never visited, leading her to uncovering years of secrets and mystery.



All the Colors of the Dark by Chris Whitaker

It is 1975, in a small town in Missouri, and girls are mysteriously disappearing. When Patch, a local boy, saves the daughter of a wealthy family from being next, he starts a series of events that will affect their lives and the lives of others in the community. In the search for answers, Patch and those who love him may end up losing each other.



We Begin at the End by Chris Whitaker

In this small town murder mystery, Vincent returns to his hometown after serving 30 years in prison for a hit and run. The victim happened to be his girlfriend's sister. His return triggers events that lead to multiple murders. Vincent's childhood best friend is now the chief of police who feels guilty for the testimony that sent his friend to prison and is determined to protect the family that Vincent has left behind.
