CHILDREN'S RIGHTS IN THE PUBLIC LIBRARY

Adopted at the Ontario Library Association General Meeting, November, 1998

Children in Public Libraries have the right to:

- 1.02.1 Intellectual freedom.
- 1.02.2 Equal access to the full range of services and materials available to other users.
- 1.02.3 A full range of materials, services and programs specifically designed and developed to meet their needs.
- 1.02.4 Adequate funding for collections and services related to population, use and
 - local community needs.
- 1.02.5 A library environment that complements their physical and developmental stages.
- 1.02.6 Trained and knowledgeable staff specializing in children's services.
- 1.02.7 Welcoming, respectful, supportive service from birth through the transition to adult user.
- 1.02.8 An advocate who will speak on their behalf to the library administration, library board, municipal council and community to make people aware of the goals of children's services.
- 1.02.9 Library policies written to include the needs of the child.
